## Severe Weather & Flood Outlook South

- A potent storm system that has triggered severe weather alerts across the Southeast on Thursday continues to slowly move through the region, where severe weather and lifethreatening flooding is expected to continue through Saturday.
- The initial round of storms developed across the Southern Plains where several communities reported hail the size of

quarters. Flooding was also witnessed outside of Fort Worth, Texas.



- Multiple rounds of storms are possible throughout the day Friday. The early day storms will tend
  to favor a large hail threat across central Texas.
- But storms that develop during the afternoon and evening across Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia
  and the Florida Panhandle will have a greater threat for a tornado. Large hail and damaging
  wind gusts over 60 mph are possible in severe storms as well.
- The abundance of strong low-level wind shear will help sustain severe thunderstorms after sunset.
- Aside from severe thunderstorms, flash flooding remains a concern in much of Alabama, Georgia and even into South Carolina.
- Flood Watches have been issued for portions of Alabama and a large section of Georgia, which includes around 11 million people.
