Severe Weather Activity

<u>Florida</u>

- The entire Florida Panhandle was rocked by tornadoes last week, Panama City Beach included.
- Senator Rick Scott joined state and county officials last Friday morning to assess the damage in the area.
- The storm left numerous properties damaged or destroyed, at least five people severely injured and about 100 households displaced.
- Areas that were most damaged were the Grand Lagoon region in Panama City Beach, and Bayou George and Resota lane in northern Bay County.

Preliminary Damage Survey Results



- The first EF-2 began at 6:25 a.m. Central, four miles outside of Simsville in Jackson County, Florida. It was on the ground for almost 30 minutes, had a maximum width of 600 yards and traveled 16.5 miles, with winds reaching 125 mph.
- The storm injured seven people, all in an RV park. It damaged several free-standing homes and damaged or destroyed more than two dozen manufactured homes, two churches, and dozens of trees.
- Two tornadoes have been confirmed in Bay County, one currently rated as an EF-2 and one an EF-3.
- The EF-3 began in the Lower Grand Lagoon area and traveled into Panama City Beach and onto Panama City, which were also significantly damaged by Hurricane Michael.
- The EF-2 traveled from Lynn Haven to Deer Point. A marina and a condo apartment building were both badly damaged.

Arctic Cold Outbreak

- The deadly arctic assault continues across the U.S., with more than 231 million Americans feeling belowaverage temperatures Monday as bitterly cold air flows in from Canada and reaches as far south as the Gulf Coast.
- And, unfortunately, the cold temperatures have turned deadly. According to a report from FOX 12 in Portland, Oregon, at least two people have died



from a cold-related illness. Another three people in Milwaukee died from apparent hypothermia over the weekend, according to FOX 6 Milwaukee.

- Over 125 million Americans are under some sort of wind chill alert from the U.S.-Canada border to the U.S.-Mexico border. Most advisories stretch through Wednesday.
- The FOX Forecast Center estimated that anyone with exposed skin in Chicago, Kansas City, Denver and Wichita could get frostbite in as little as 30 minutes.
