


Severe Weather Southern Plains

- The FOX Forecast Center is tracking a renewed threat of severe weather this week, with millions of people across portions of Texas and Oklahoma, including Dallas and Waco, on alert for potentially dangerous weather.
- Areas from northeastern Oklahoma, including Tulsa, through southeastern Kansas and into western Missouri, including Kansas





- A larger area of the central Plains and Midwest will be at risk of severe weather on Wednesday, including portions of eastern Oklahoma and Kansas, southeastern Nebraska, southern lowa and parts of Missouri.
- Severe storms are expected to erupt Thursday across portions of Texas and Oklahoma, as well as farther to the east in the Ark-La-Tex region.
- The ingredients look like they'll come together for thunderstorms to produce large hail, damaging wind gusts and possible tornadoes.
- Flash flooding will also be a concern as storms that develop could dump heavy rain.
- Flash flooding is possible from Oklahoma and Texas to the Tennessee and lower Mississippi
 valleys, but the highest risk will be found in Arkansas, including the cities of Fort Smith and Little
 Rock.
