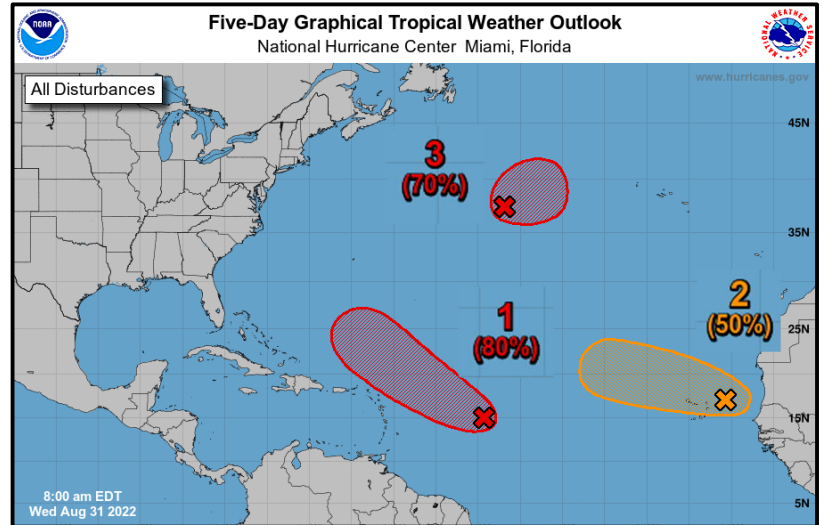
Tropical Activity

Disturbance 1

- Located several hundred miles E of the Lesser Antilles
- Tropical depression likely to form within the next couple of days
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Medium (60%); 5-days: High (80%)

Disturbance 2

- Located between the west coast of Africa and the Cabo Verde Islands
- Could become a short-lived tropical depression during the next couple of days
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Medium (40%); 5-days: Medium (50%)



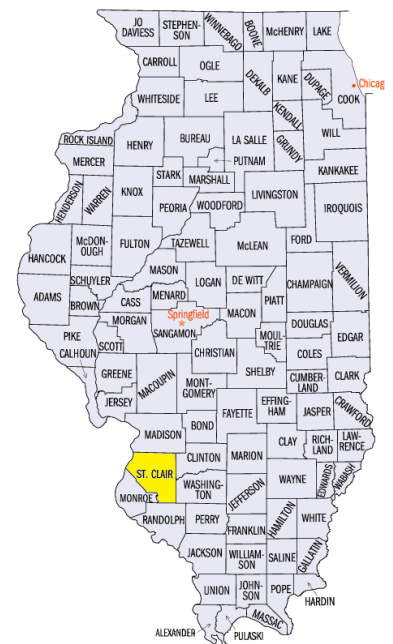
Disturbance 3

- Expected to form within the next day or so over the central subtropical Atlantic
- A tropical or subtropical depression could form later this week
- Formation chance – 48-hours: Medium (60%); 5-days: High (70%)

Declaration Request

Illinois

- The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) went door to door in the Metro East assessing damage from the historic July to August floods on Wednesday, August 17th.
- Representatives began their assessment on Terrace Drive in East St. Louis, one of the hardest hit areas in St. Clair County.
- They were joined by Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA) and St. Clair County Emergency Management Agency officials.
- More than 25 families and their pets had to be rescued from their homes during the flooding.
- An estimated 600 St. Clair County households were damaged by flash flooding.
- Governor of Illinois issued a disaster proclamation for St. Clair and Washington Counties on August 3rd due to severe weather and flooding.
- On August 30th, Governor JB Pritzker requested a major disaster declaration to include individual assistance for St. Clair County.
